From the Pastor's Desk,

Don't you love the sayings on signs that churches put out sometimes. I saw one the other day that got me to thinking.

We may be nuts, but we are attached to the right bolt.

Some people have the innate mechanical ability to look at a nut or a bolt and tell you what size wrench it will take it is know the thread size. I am not one of those people. If I have a loose bolt that I need to find a nut for, I have to go by trial and error. I have to just try one to see if it fits. Most of the time, I don't get it right with the first try. If the nut is too small for the bolt it won't go on the bolt at all. If it is too big, it slides over the bolt and hangs loosely around the bolt. Neither will work. Then when I think I've got the right size and the nut starts to go on the bolt, it stops after the first thread and won't go any further. Either the bolt is English thread while the nut is metric thread or vice versa. Then I think that it should still work and try to force the nut onto the bolt! That will only ruin the threads on both the nut and the bolt.

When I find the right nut to go on the bolt, there is much rejoicing. Now I have to find the right wrench or socket size for my match, and the process starts all over again!

Anyway, life and the combinations found in life are lot like this. If the right person gets with the right job then there is great rejoicing! There is a perfect fit. But sometimes a person might have to try out different jobs until there is a fit. It happens in relationships, too. When we were young we would date different people and sometimes we wouldn't fit together, but when the right person is found there is great rejoicing!

These days in our society there are people looking for the right spiritual fit. They may find something that looks like it will work for them only to find out the fit was not perfect and they continued to try to make it work, and only ruin themselves and the religion they tried out. But when people find God through Jesus Christ then they find the perfect fit. Jesus Christ is the perfect kind of bolt because He can be whatever thread you are and when you get together with Him, it is always a perfect fit.

The other aspect of that quote is the fact of realizing that we are nuts! And maybe in the mental connotation of that word as well. Sometimes it must seem to God like we are all crazy by the stuff that we say and do! But thanks to the match made through Jesus we can be put on the right bolt and be able to do our jobs to the best of our ability with the help of God Himself. One other thing, a nut is not very useful until it is matched up with the right bolt. Other wise it just lays around in the bottom of the toolbox, waiting to be matched up. But the bolt can be used in many other ways without the nut, but the nut has very few uses without the bolt.

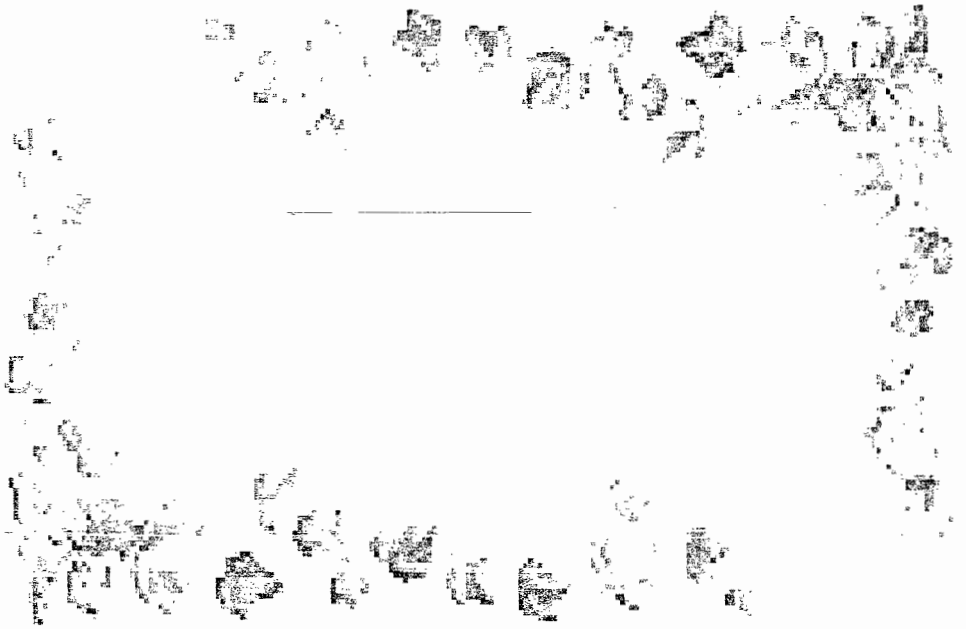
